1. FOREWORD FROM THE CHAIR

IndyACT was founded on the belief that dedicated individuals and communities can shift systems, influence policies, and bring about lasting change. Looking back at the achievements detailed in this report, I am deeply proud of how our team and partners have lived up to that mission.

A few years ago, IndyACT set out with bold ambitions: to conserve biodiversity, fight climate change, advance a green and circular economy, expand marine protected areas, and empower civil society. These goals were never small and they became even more relevant in the context of war, economic collapse, social breakdown, and growing environmental degradation. At IndyACT, we have mastered the art of transforming challenges into opportunities for meaningful and lasting change.

This year, we not only advanced a 100% green economy vision for Lebanon, but also translated it into concrete pathways for daily life and for our country's strategic position within the Mediterranean. We stood firmly in the global fight against plastic pollution, uniting civil society under a common agenda to cut production at the source, enforce the polluter-pays principle, and promote circularity.

On climate, IndyACT continued to lead with vision and action. We played a central role in shaping Lebanon's Low Emissions Development Strategy, ensuring inclusivity across critical sectors like energy, transport, agriculture, and tourism. We built the capacity of major NGOs and municipalities to integrate climate-smart planning into their work, laying the foundation for long-term resilience.

We also turned our focus to Lebanon's most vulnerable ecosystems. IndyACT is the first Lebanese NGO to have a co-management mandate for two RAMSAR sites, the Palm Island Nature Reserve (PINR) and the Ammiq Wetland. In PINR, we are working to make this marine protected area a tool to recover local fisheries. In the Ammiq wetlands, we are spearheading a multi-year project to protect species, improve water governance, and ease pressure from unsustainable agricultural practices. At sea, we raised the profile of marine protected areas, underlining their value for fisheries and ecotourism, while campaigning tirelessly to safeguard 30% of Lebanon's marine resources by 2030.

Through all of this, IndyACT has remained a force for civil society, amplifying local voices while connecting them to global movements. Our work this year is proof that even in the most difficult circumstances, progress is possible when vision meets persistence.



This report reflects not only what IndyACT has accomplished but also the courage and dedication of our team, allies, and supporters. None of these results would be possible without your engagement, trust, and solidarity.

As we look ahead, we know the challenges are immense, but so is the potential for impact. Our work will continue to push for systemic change, amplify grassroots leadership, and ensure that justice and sustainability are at the heart of decision-making.

Thank you for being part of this journey. Together, we will continue to act for a just, sustainable, and resilient future.

FROM CRISIS TO RECOVERY

IndyACT has gone through turbulent times during the past period, which we are happy to say that we are finally back! The 2019 Lebanese protests, which led to the resignation of the government, followed by the economic collapse, a pandemic, and the explosion in the Beirut port has crippled the organization.

Almost all of the existing team members in IndyACT had to leave, all the existing financial assets become stuck in the collapsed banking sector, the organization changed its location, and in 2020 and 2021 almost no funding was available.

A NEW VISION FOR THE FUTURE

Despite this tough situation, IndyACT gathered its members and changed its strategic approach. It decided to work on shifting its focus to reverse the economic collapse, which led to the “100% Lebanon” project, in which a green economic recovery vision was drafted for the country in an inclusive and participatory process, bringing together various stakeholders towards a common direction of travel.

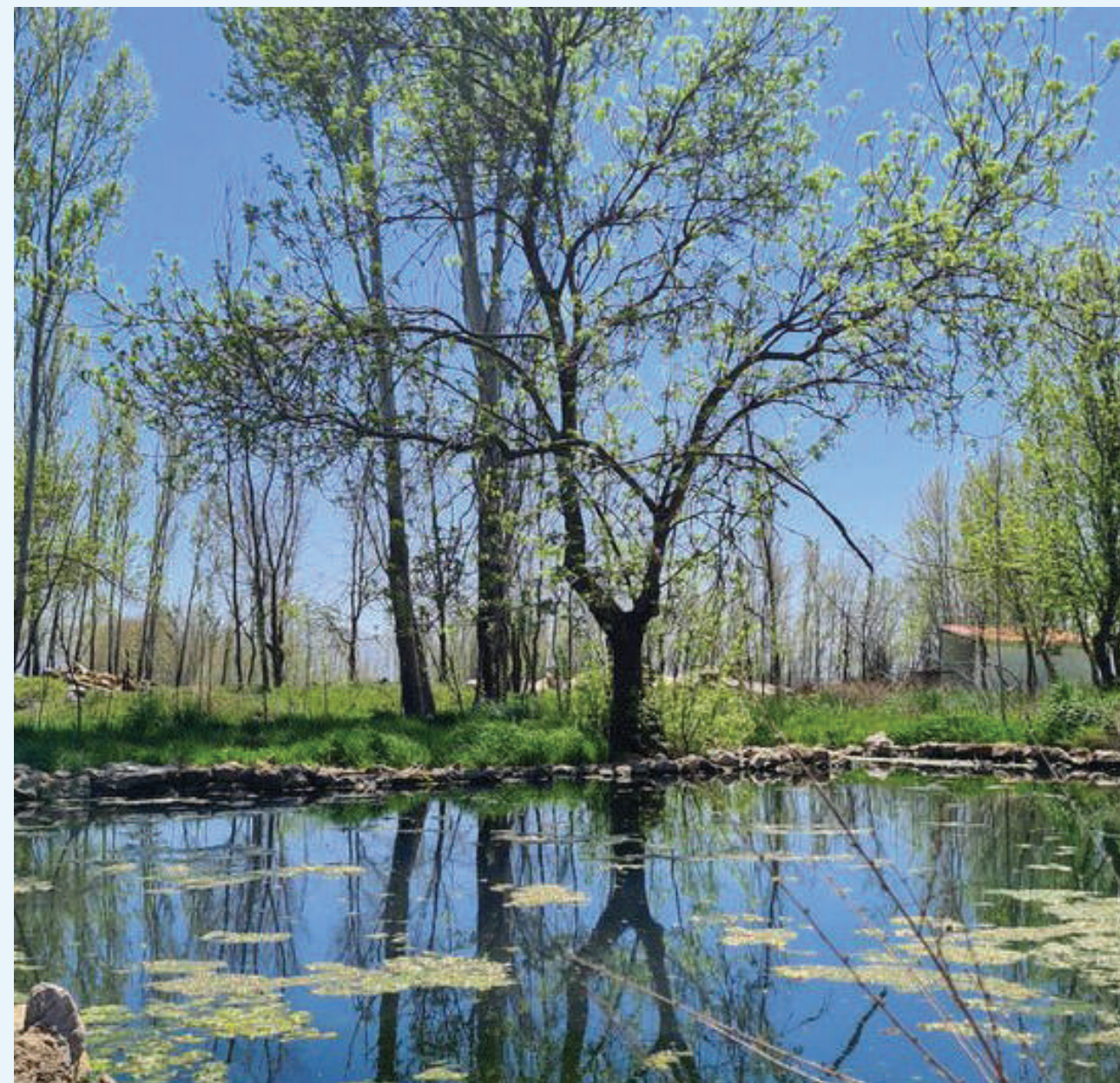


The initiative provided hope of a prosperous future for the country, and made the organization realize the importance of Lebanon’s natural uniqueness. IndyACT then started focusing on investing in this natural heritage, establishing the conservation program.

At the same time, IndyACT did not stop working on its primary mandate, which is following on the key international multilateral environmental negotiations at that time, especially the 30x30 target in the Convention of Biological Diversity (CBD), the initiation of a mandate for a new agreement on plastics, and the global framework for chemicals.

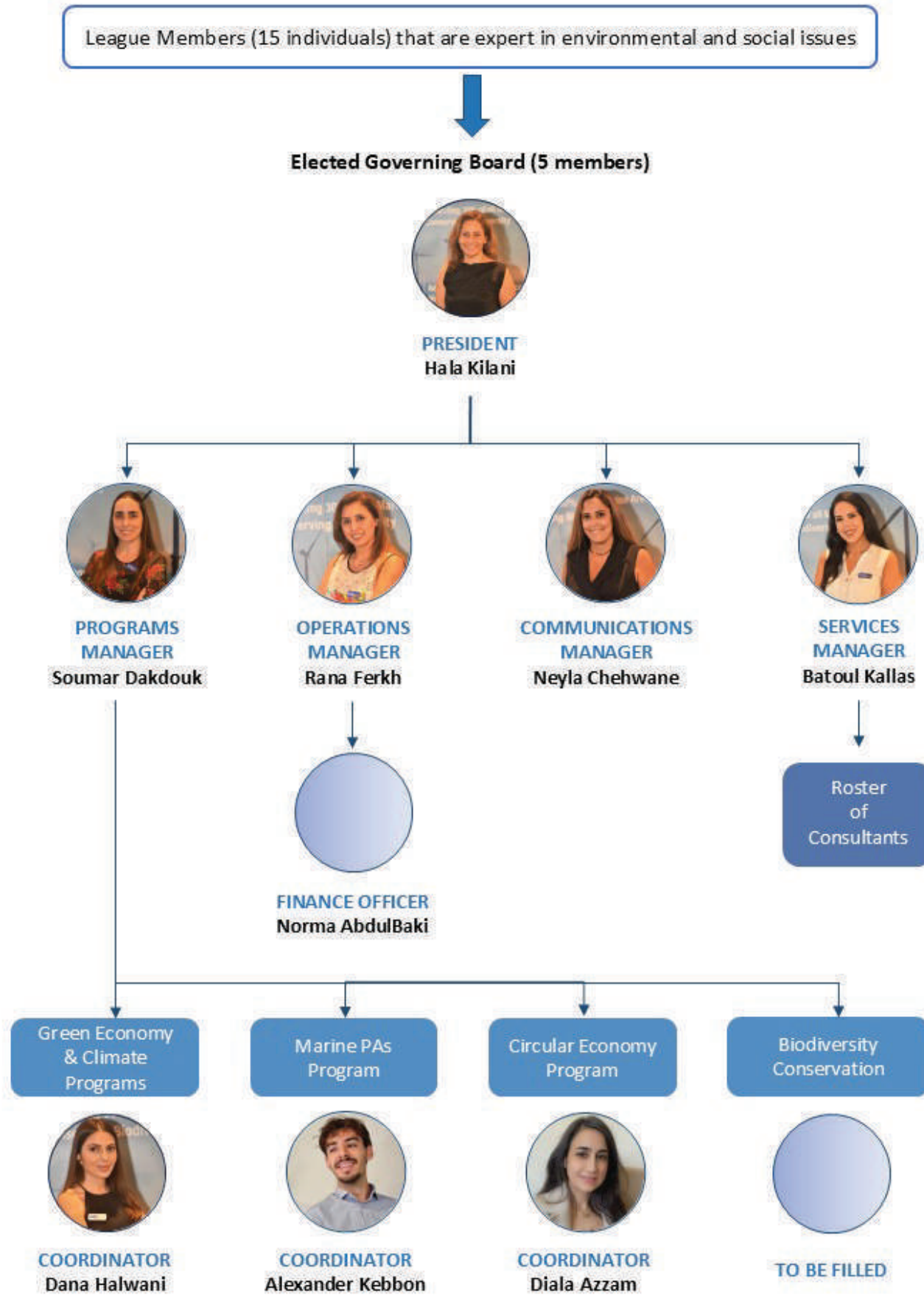
IndyACT was successful on all fronts. Now, the Conservation program is the biggest in the organization. All three international negotiation objectives were achieved. At the same time, IndyACT team has been restored, and funding increased gradually, reaching more than 500,000 USD in 2024.

Now, IndyACT is running five programs that we believe will have the ability to create the necessary change in Lebanon, the region, and in international negotiations to face the world’s biggest challenges. We look forward to engaging you in these critical but exciting times.

DRIVING A GREEN RECOVERY IN LEBANON

IndyACT aims to spearhead a transition towards a sustainable and resilient future and empower countries within the MENA region to adopt green economy development strategies.

100% Lebanon a green economic recovery vision

IndyACT in collaboration with Green Mind Association, spearheaded the development of a comprehensive Green Economy Vision, titled “100% Lebanon”, which was endorsed by more than 200 organizations so far. This ambitious initiative aims to guide Lebanon's economic recovery and integrate the green economy concept into future development plans through a well-defined and holistic approach. The vision provided evidence that the recommended targets represent the fastest and most effective path to achieving prosperity and maximizing GDP growth for the country.

Five sectoral strategies were further developed,, providing a dive-in on how to implement the green economy in energy, transport, agriculture, tourism, and material management sectors. These sectoral strategies, were formulated through a multi-stakeholder consultative processes led by experts in the field. The vision and sectoral strategies fed into the formulation of Lebanon's Long-Term Low-Emission Development Strategy (LEDS), which was published in early 2025 and called for negative net-emissions by 2050.

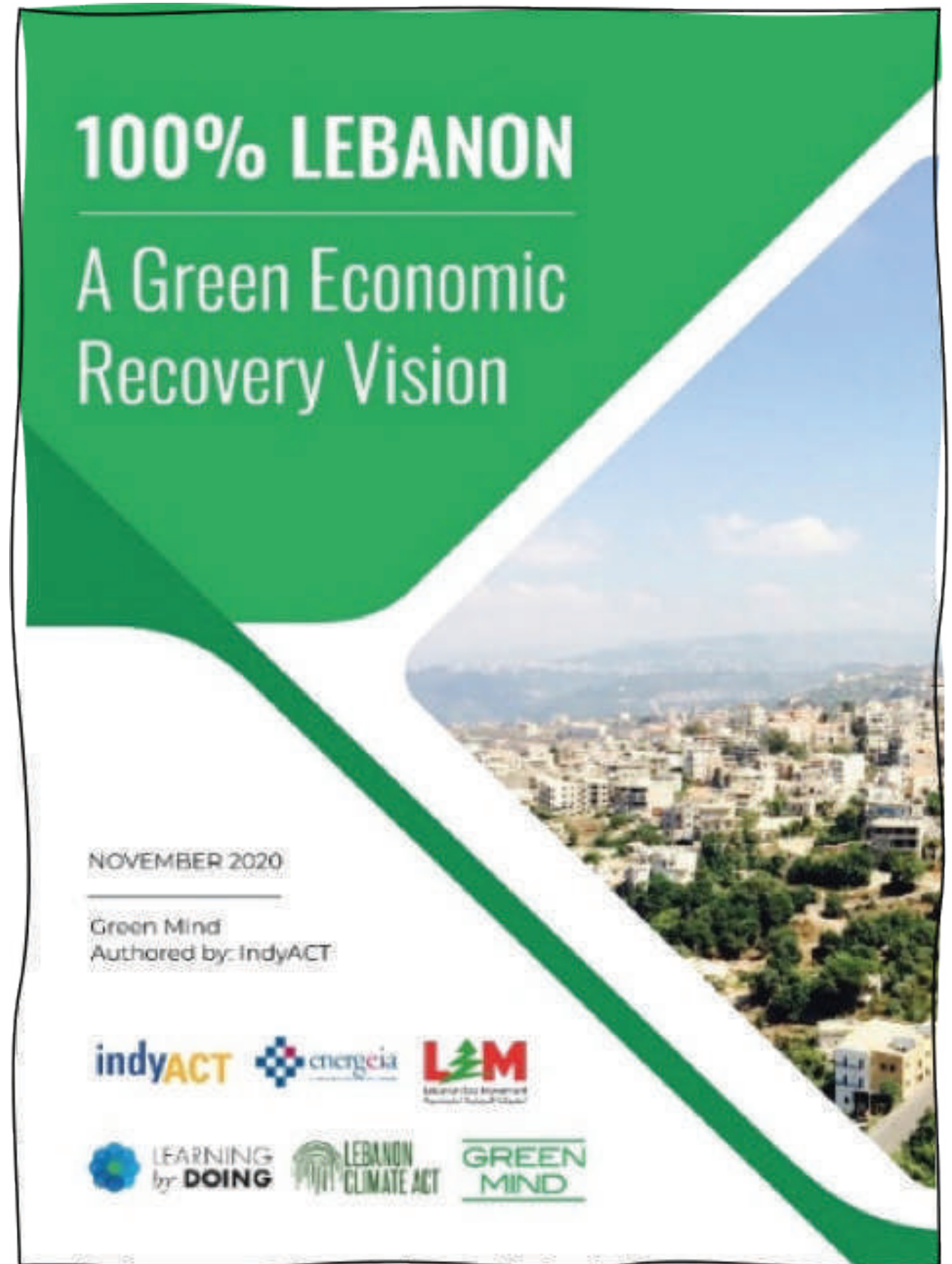


Figure 5, 100% Lebanon - Draft Zero Document's Cover

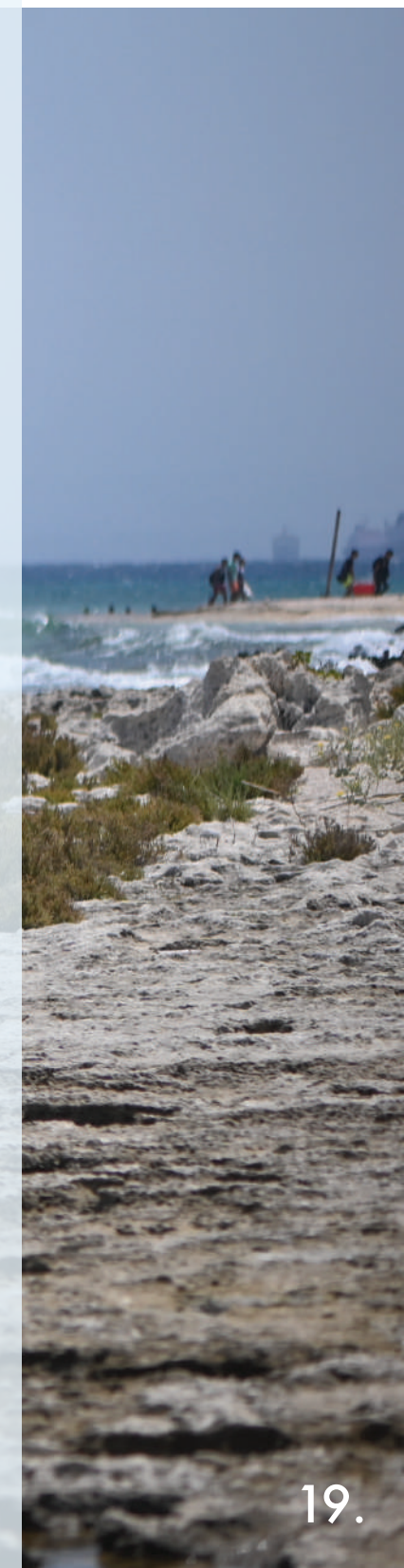

Green Economy Network in the MENA Region – GENA



Building on the “100% Lebanon” success, IndyACT is working to replicate this experience in the region by establishing a Green Economy Network (under the name GENA) in the MENA region, which currently includes NGOs from Egypt, Tunisia, Jordan, Iraq, and Lebanon. The network’s mission is to spearhead the transition toward a sustainable and resilient future in the MENA region and to empower target countries to adopt green economy development strategies.

Additionally, it aims to play a proactive role in shaping global policies on sustainable development by representing the MENA region’s civil society voice in relevant Multilateral Environmental Agreements (MEAs).

LEADING NATIONAL AND REGIONAL CLIMATE ACTION

Climate change remains at the heart of IndyACT’s mission. As a pioneer environmental NGO in the Arab region, IndyACT continues to lead national and regional efforts to promote climate action, influence policy, and mobilize non-state actors. Throughout 2024, IndyACT reinforced its role as a trusted stakeholder, partner, and expert across a wide range of climate-related activities, including advocacy, capacity building, community engagement, and policy dialogue.



POLICY ENGAGEMENT AND COALITION BUILDING

On the international level, IndyACT continues to follow on the international climate change negotiations, providing valuable analysis for key stakeholders in the region. IndyACT is working for various actors across the Mediterranean to develop a new program that strengthen climate change commitments by governments, businesses, and local authorities.

On the national level, IndyACT actively monitors and contributes to the national climate agenda by engaging with ministries, municipalities, and civil society actors. We advocate for inclusive and science-based policies that align with Lebanon’s international commitments, and we co-develop action plans through participatory processes. IndyACT continues to support the Lebanon Climate Act, where over 150 municipalities and businesses have pledged to take climate action.

INDYACT'S ROLE IN LEBANON'S LEDS

Through its 100% Lebanon initiative, IndyACT played a central role in shaping Lebanon's Low-Emission Development Strategy (LEDS), submitted to the UNFCCC in early 2025.

The organization led inclusive multi-stakeholder consultations involving over 200 entities, coordinated expert input, and worked closely with the Ministry of Environment to develop five sectoral strategies—in energy, transport, agriculture, tourism, and material management—aligned with global sustainability standards.

These strategies formed the policy backbone of the LEDS, embedding sustainability principles into national development planning and advancing Lebanon's green transition agenda, while directly informing the content of the official LT-LEDS.

STRENGTHENING CAPACITY AND COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

Stakeholder Participation and Community Engagement

In 2024, IndyACT participated in and contributed to numerous national and regional workshops and consultation meetings addressing climate change from multidisciplinary perspectives—including food security, health, agriculture, youth, and natural resources.

KEY PROJECTS INCLUDED:

1. Mercy Corps Lebanon Training (May 2024) on Climate Smart Commitment. As part of our ongoing role in capacity-building and knowledge transfer, IndyACT facilitated a two-day training workshop in May 2024 for Mercy Corps Lebanon staff under the "Climate Smart Commitment 2024" initiative.

2. Training for municipalities on developing climate action plans. IndyACT is actively contributing to the design of a new national framework that will guide and scale up municipal climate action in Lebanon. In this effort, IndyACT provided several trainings and guidance to municipalities on how to develop and implement climate actions.

BREAKING THE PLASTIC CYCLE AT ITS SOURCE

Picture this, by the time you finish reading this article, 2 truckloads of plastic will have been dumped into the ocean. Multiply that every minute, every hour, every day... and you begin to see the scale of this crisis.



Plastic is everywhere: in the deepest oceans, the Arctic snow and even in our bloodstreams. Every year 14 million tons of plastic leak into aquatic ecosystems. Plastic carries toxic chemicals, chokes wildlife, disrupts food chains, and worsens climate change through greenhouse gas emissions.

We live in a linear economy: take resources, make products, use them briefly and throw them away. That’s how we ended up with 75% of all plastic ever made in landfills or polluting nature.

Recycling alone won’t save us: less than 10% of global plastic gets recycled.

Since 2022, the world has been trying to draft a new Global Plastics Treaty, and since then IndyACT has been focusing its efforts under the Circular Economy Program to achieve an ambitious agreement.

IndyACT'S POLICY DEMANDS AND SOLUTIONS

THE CIRCULAR ECONOMY FLIPS THE SCRIPT. FOR PLASTICS, THIS MEANS THREE THINGS:

1. Eliminate what we don't need (single-use packaging, toxic additives)
2. Innovate safer designs (reusable, composable)
3. Circulate everything we use (keep it in the economy)

If we fail to redesign how we make and use plastic, no cleanup effort will ever catch up.

We have developed a common policy position for Lebanese civil society in relation to using the circular economy or zero waste approach as the basis for addressing the plastics crisis.

We pushed decision makers to have this treaty cut plastic pollution at the source.

OUR DEMANDS ARE CLEAR:



Cut plastic production at the source (implement caps and bans on the most harmful plastics and additives)

Make polluters pay (Extended Producer Responsibility)

Circular Economy: eliminate, innovate, circulate.

Ensure equity (provide funding and technology transfer for countries like Lebanon to leapfrog into circular solutions)

“Safeguarding Marine Ecosystems for Generations to Come.”



STRENGTHENING PALM ISLAND NATURE RESERVE

In 2024, IndyACT made significant strides in advancing marine conservation in Lebanon, with a particular focus on the Palm Island Nature Reserve (PINR) and the national 30x30 campaign.

In partnership with MedPAN, the French Embassy, and the MedFund; IndyACT initiated the update of PINR’s management plan, establish a management team, initiate conservation measures, and supported the creation of an enforcement mechanism to improve protection and compliance within the reserve.

These efforts are part of a broader strategy to enhance PINR’s effectiveness as a model Marine Protected Area (MPA) and to strengthen local marine governance frameworks. One key aspect of PINR work is to establish it as a fisheries management tool, helping in the recovery of surrounding fishing grounds.

LEADING LEBANON’S 30×30 MARINE CONSERVATION CAMPAIGN

IndyACT also continued to lead the national “30x30” campaign, which calls for the protection of at least 30% of Lebanon’s marine waters by 2030. A major highlight was the organization of a national conference that gathered policymakers, experts, civil society, and coastal stakeholders to discuss the role of MPAs and sustainable fisheries in safeguarding marine resources.

Under this campaign, IndyACT founded with other organizations the National Campaign for an MPA Network. IndyACT also led on developing a comprehensive advocacy strategy and trained campaign members on key advocacy topics such as policy influence, strategic communication, and community engagement. An advocacy toolkit was produced to guide campaign activities, alongside the development of content and materials to support public outreach.

These initiatives form part of IndyACT’s ongoing commitment to supporting the creation of a resilient, science-based MPA network that contributes to biodiversity conservation, sustainable fisheries, and the well-being of coastal communities across the Mediterranean.

“Protecting Biodiversity with Integrity and Vision.”

NATIONWIDE FAUNA ASSESSMENT AND NATURE RESERVE PLANNING

The year 2024 was a milestone for IndyACT’s Conservation Program, marked by the successful completion of major initiatives and the launch of new ones.

The most significant achievement was the completion of a nationwide fauna assessment and the development of priority conservation and site-specific monitoring plans for all 18 Nature Reserves in Lebanon. This work was carried out under the “STEPping up Nature Reserves Capacity – STEP4Nature” project, funded by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and International Cooperation of the Italian Republic through the Italian Agency for Development Cooperation (AICS), and implemented by the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) in coordination with Lebanon’s Ministry of Environment. IndyACT led a consortium that included the Association for Bird Conservation in Lebanon (ABCL), the University of Balamand (UOB), and Istituto Oikos Onlus. The project engaged nine leading biodiversity experts and more than 12 field officers to conduct comprehensive assessments covering key terrestrial fauna groups, including mammals, birds, insects, reptiles, and amphibians. The findings will serve as a critical foundation for the effective management of Lebanon’s Nature Reserves and the long-term preservation of the country’s biodiversity.

NEW CONSERVATION INITIATIVES



In parallel, IndyACT supported the establishment of Hima Wadi el Qaraqir and developed its management plan, under contract with the Green Community NGO. Working closely with the municipalities of Zgharta Caza, IndyACT provided technical guidance on creating the Hima.

AND COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT



Through an inclusive and participatory process that engaged the local community, a management plan was developed, and the newly established Hima Committee was trained on its implementation.

2024 also marked the start of two exciting new initiatives.



The first was the co-management of the Ammiq Wetland, following the signing of a co-management agreement with its owners, the Skaff Estate. The second was the launch of the process to develop Lebanon's first National Monk Seal Action Plan, in collaboration with the Ministry of Environment and with support from the Monk Seal Alliance.

These two initiatives will form the cornerstone of IndyACT's Conservation Program in 2025—stay tuned for more progress ahead!

6. OUR SERVICES

2024 SERVICES

2024 was a busy year for IndyACT Services Department. The organization led a consortium of partners, particularly University of Balamand, Oikos Instituto, and Association of Bird Conservation in Lebanon to implement a UNDP contract, under the Step for Nature Program, funded by the Italian Cooperation Agency, to conduct a Fauna Assessment in all 18 official Nature Reserves in the country. The work also included the development Fauna monitoring plans and protocols for all these reserves. This major project will improve Fauna conservation in all of Lebanon's Nature Reserves.

IndyACT was also contracted by Green Community NGO to establish a Hima in Wadi el Qaraqir. IndyACT assisted relevant municipalities in the process, and led a participatory process for the development of a Hima management plan.



In addition, IndyACT was contracted by the Lebanon Environment Forum (LEF) to develop an advocacy strategy for the national MPA network campaign, and the train the members of the campaign on advocacy tools and methods. Under this service, IndyACT also developed an advocacy tool kit for the use of campaign members. The organization also provided advocacy mentoring and coaching services to the LEF team.

Finally, as part of Mercy Corps effort to develop a climate change pillar in their program, they contracted IndyACT to conduct a training on climate change to its relevant team members. IndyACT delivered this training with a focus on international and national climate science, policy, and action.

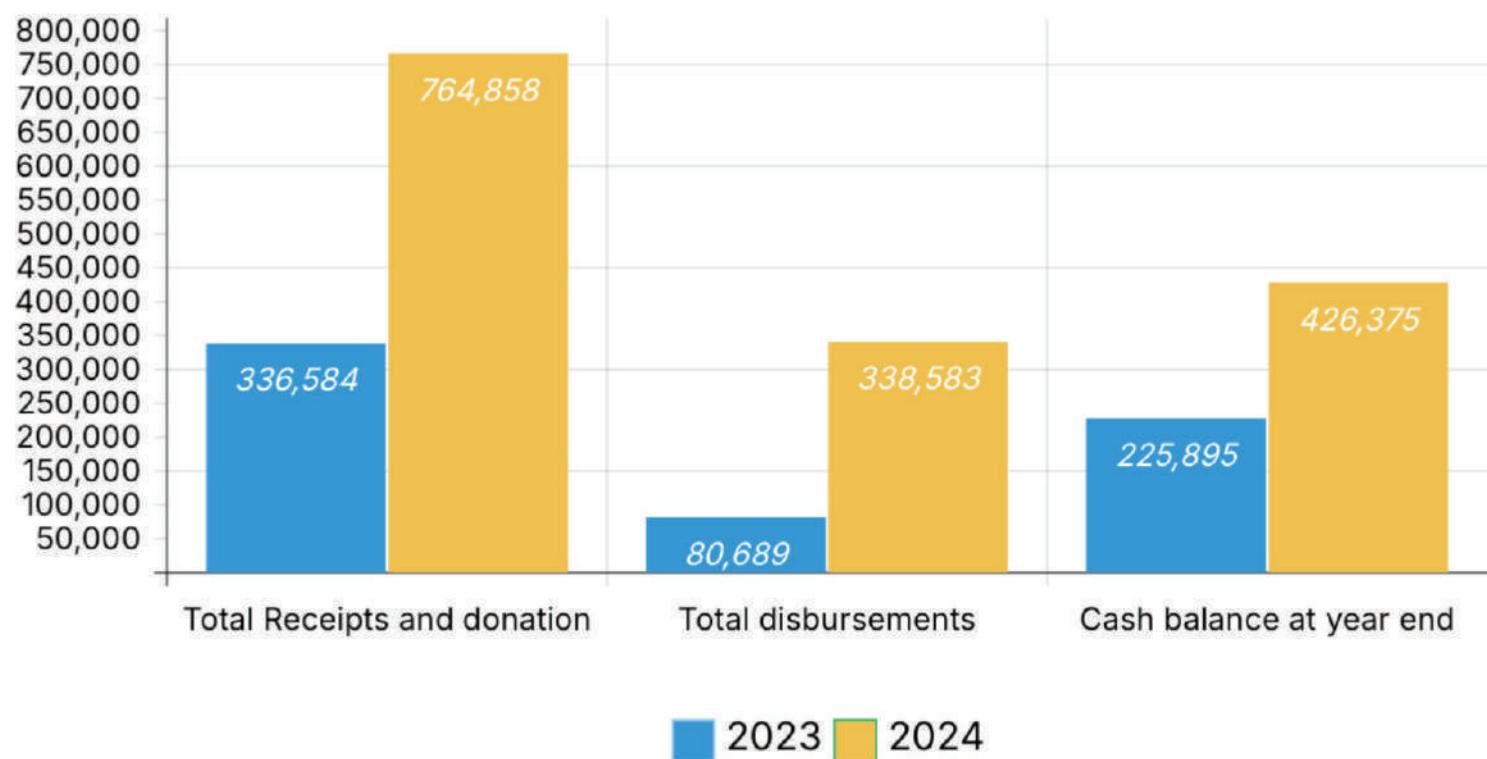
IndyACT is committed to full transparency and accountability in all aspects of its financial management.
